

It is an enabler of organisational learning. Knowledge Management programmes can yield enormous benefits to individuals and organizations if they are purposeful, concrete, and action-oriented.

This training programme will equip the participants to understand the tools and techniques of e-Governance and Knowledge Management and methodology to implement the same across the organization/departments.
